RE: Flatiron Building Museum Opening

The Executive Board of the Lacombe & District Historical Society (LDHS) is excited to announce the opening of the Flatiron Building Museum, coinciding with the Lacombe Culture & Harvest Festival, September 25th-26th 2021.

In partnership with the Alberta Foundation of the Arts, we are pleased to be the first institution to simultaneously host three traveling exhibitions, featuring the diverse peoples & landscapes of Alberta. Exhibitions on display include *Life Lit Up; In the Moment; & Arthur Nishimura: Mystical Landscapes*. This unique opportunity will be coupled with an exhibition developed in-house and made our own Ben Cameron Studio Collection of cameras and photography equipment, as well as his photographs of late 19th - early 20th century Lacombe.

“This new endeavour will assist with the revitalization of the downtown Lacombe area. We are looking forward to being a lively part of the downtown community, hosting evening events in the building such as our heritage fashion shows, fiber art classes, history lectures, night tours, whiskey tastings and more - giving the community the ability to visit us and learn more about local history, in new and engaging ways, outside of the typical hours of 9-5 in the region.” – Melissa Blunden, Executive Director, LDHS.

The Flatiron Building Museum will open its doors to the public 10am - 4pm for the duration of the Culture & Harvest Festival weekend, with tours of the space available, gallery halls open and demonstrations ongoing. It will remain open to the public Tuesday-Sundays 10-4pm until October 24th.

November 2021 exhibition plans include *At Home & Abroad*, an in-house developed exhibition that explores a deeper look at the veterans from the Lacombe area. Opening Date TBA.
